**BEFORE CUTTING AND SEWING, PLEASE READ ALL INSTRUCTIONS TO FAMILIARIZE YOURSELF WITH THEM.
 A 1/4" seam allowance is used throughout.**

Materials Needed and Cutting Instructions

(all measurements based on accurate cutting, 1/4" seam allowance, and 42" wide strips)

Fabrics are listed by Novella colorways – first the (Driftwood colorway) (then Spice) (then Indigo) in this order.

2/3 yard of Peoney or Rain (PWVW053-gypsy Peoney) (PWVW050-purple Rain) (PWVW053-teal Peoney)	A – Cut 1 - 9 1/2" x 10 1/2" rectangle, 2 - 10 1/2" x 10 1/2" squares, and 2 - 10 1/2" x 16 1/2" rectangles.
1 yard of Zig Zag (PWVW052-aqua) (PWVW052-gypsy) (PWVW052-indigo)	B – Cut 2 - 9 1/2" x 10 1/2" rectangles, 2 - 10 1/2" x 10 1/2" squares, 2 - 10 1/2" x 16 1/2" rectangles, and 4 - 2 1/2" x 10 1/2" rectangles.
2/3 yard of Rain (PWVW050-aqua) (PWVW050-lavender) (PWVW050-tangerine)	C – Cut 3 - 9 1/2" x 10 1/2" rectangles, 2 - 10 1/2" x 10 1/2" squares, and 3 - 2 1/2" x 10 1/2" rectangles.
2/3 yard of Heart de Flur (PWVW051-charcoal) (PWVW051-gypsy) (PWVW051-indigo)	D – cut 3 - 9 1/2" x 10 1/2" rectangles and 4 - 10 1/2" x 10 1/2" squares.
2/3 yard of Peoney (PWVW053-teal) (PWVW053-scarlett) (PWVW053-tangerine)	E – Cut 2 - 9 1/2" x 10 1/2" rectangles, 2 - 10 1/2" x 10 1/2" squares, and 2 - 10 1/2" x 16 1/2" rectangles.
1 yard of Fannelopy (PWVW049-aqua) (PWVW053-gypsy) (PWVW053-indigo)	F – cut 2 - 9 1/2" x 10 1/2" rectangles, and 3 - 10 1/2" x 16 1/2" rectangles. Note: Directional fabric (Make sure the 10 1/2" side and the 16 1/2" side are cut the length of the fabric.)
2/3 yard (PWVW051-gypsy Heart de Flur) (PWVW053-gypsy Peoney) (PWVW052-tangerine Zig Zag)	G – cut 3 - 9 1/2" x 10 1/2" rectangles, 2 - 10 1/2" x 10 1/2" squares, and 2 - 2 1/2" x 10 1/2" rectangles.
1/4 yard solid (black) (tangerine) (green)	H -- cut 6 - 2 1/2" x 10 1/2" rectangles.
1/4 yard solid (gold) (red) (magenta)	I -- cut 7 - 2 1/2" x 10 1/2" rectangles.
1/4 yard solid (grey) (grey) (orange)	J -- cut 4 - 2 1/2" x 10 1/2" rectangles.
5/8 yard for binding	We cut 2 1/2" x various length strips from the leftover pieces of fabric and sewed them together for the binding strips.
5 yards for backing • 66" x 86" quilt batting	

Sewing Instructions

1. Refer to the illustration of the quilt.

It is divided into 4 large sections which consist of Block A units, Block B units, and Block C units.

Section 1 - 1st large rectangle (Block A) - Sew a $9\frac{1}{2}''$ x $10\frac{1}{2}''$ A rectangle to a $2\frac{1}{2}''$ x $10\frac{1}{2}''$ I rectangle to a $9\frac{1}{2}''$ x $10\frac{1}{2}''$ B rectangle.

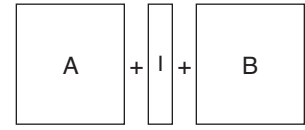

Section 1 - 2nd large rectangle (Block B) -

Sew a $10\frac{1}{2}''$ x $10\frac{1}{2}''$ C square to a $10\frac{1}{2}''$ x $10\frac{1}{2}''$ D square.

Press and sew the A block to the B block.

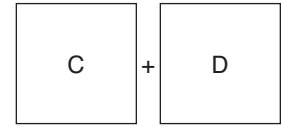

Section 1 - 3rd large rectangle (Block C) - Sew a $2\frac{1}{2}''$ x $10\frac{1}{2}''$ H rectangle to a $2\frac{1}{2}''$ x $10\frac{1}{2}''$ I rectangle to a $10\frac{1}{2}''$ x $16\frac{1}{2}''$ B rectangle.

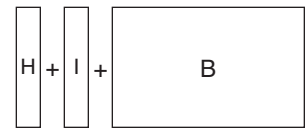

2. Continue this step, sewing the pieces in the large rectangles together in each section, then sewing the large rectangles together to complete each section. When the sections of the first row are complete, sew them together into a row. Press.

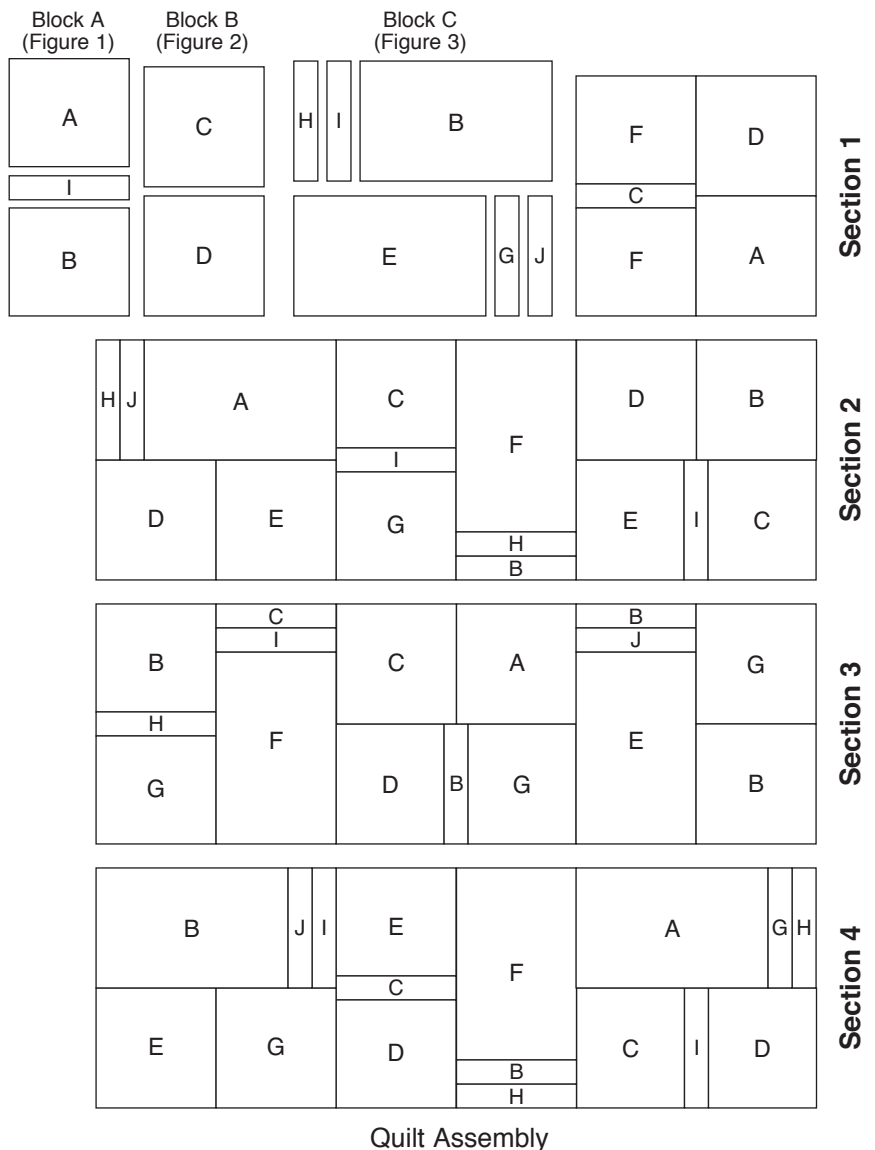
Continue, sewing the sections, then sewing them together to complete the rows.

3. Sew the rows together.

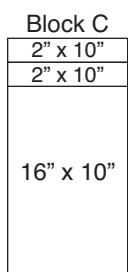
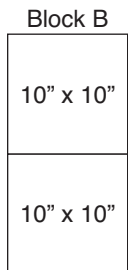
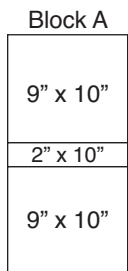
Press.

4. Layer, quilt, and finish.

We quilted zig zags, diamonds, and other geometric designs in the blocks.
